To my new family at the Parish of All Saints,

Grace and peace in our Lord Jesus Christ! It is with joy, humility, and gratitude that I write to you as I prepare to join you as your new rector, beginning January 11, 2026. I am deeply honored by this call, and I look forward to serving Christ together with you in the days and years ahead.

Allow me to share a little of my journey with you. I was born and raised in Houston, Texas, and ordained to the priesthood in 2002 in the Diocese of Texas. My office door and email inbox will always be open. I believe deeply in collaboration with the vestry and parish leadership, and I seek to foster a spirit of prayerful discernment and consensus in our common life.

As we take up our ministry together, I am mindful of our Lord's words: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19–20). This mission belongs not only to the clergy but to the whole people of God. My hope and prayer is that, together, we will grow in worship, fellowship, and service, bearing witness to Christ's love in our parish, in our community, and beyond.

I am humbled to become your rector and to share in the life of worship, fellowship, and mission that marks the Parish of All Saints. Please know that I am holding all of you in prayer as I prepare for this transition, and I ask for your prayers for me as well.
